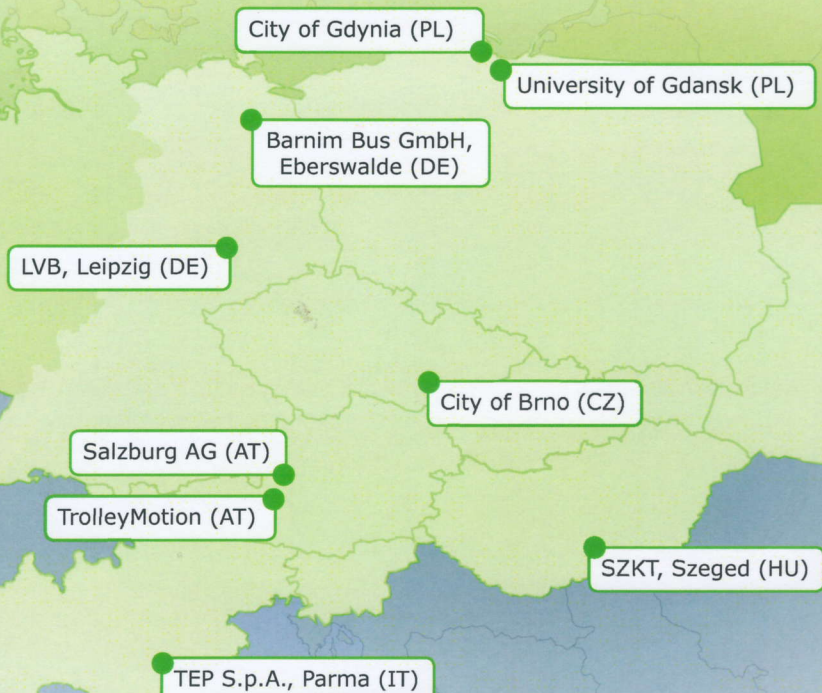

Declaration for Electric Trolleybus Mobility

The Central Europe Programme aims at improving accessibility of and within Central Europe by promoting intelligent and sustainable transport and advanced technological and nontechnological alternative transport solutions for enhancing access. The Programme therefore provides funding to the project TROLLEY – Promoting Electric Public Transport.

By covering major trolleybus cities in Central Europe, Salzburg, Brno, Gdynia, Eberswalde, Szeged, Parma as well as Leipzig, a city that is about to reintroduce electric buses, the project represents a wide range of Central European stakeholders being fully committed to sustainable electric mobility.

As TROLLEY partners we aim to promote electric public transport in our cities and regions by optimising energy use, by increasing public transport efficiency, by reshaping the image of trolleybuses throughout Europe.




Through our signatures we demonstrate our awareness of the potential of electric public transport in European cities and our motivation and commitment to support the TROLLEY Project.

- ▶ To work towards creating the expected impacts on improving accessibility and enhancing the quality of public transport in Central Europe.




